



Creating High-Stakes Assessments: Alternatives to Quiz Generator Exams

Many courses use traditional exams as their final assessment, but what about alternatives? Alternative assessments are more accurate reflections of the critical thinking and problem-solving skills that you want your students to demonstrate.

Assessment Goals

First, consider the following questions:

- What learning objectives and other skills (e.g., writing, public speaking, collaborating, etc.) do the students need to demonstrate during the assessment?
- How will these proficiencies be measured?
- What CoursePlus features will be used to support [academic integrity](#)?

Assessment Formats and Tools

Select an assessment format that matches the assessment goal, and then determine what tools are available to you to implement.

Analysis	<i>Compare, analyze, classify, survey, differentiate, distinguish</i>	Case studies, critiques, labs, papers, projects, debates, or concept maps that require students to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Discriminate or select relevant and irrelevant parts• Determine how elements function together• Determine bias, values, or underlying intent in presented material	Drop Box (file submission)
Evaluation	<i>Judge, criticize, support, evaluate, appraise, critique</i>	Journals, diaries, critiques, reflections, problem sets, product reviews, or studies that require students to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Test, monitor, judge, or critique readings, performances, or products against established criteria or standards	Drop Box (file submission), Peer Assessment, VoiceThread (presentation)
Creation	<i>Create, generate, plan, produce, design, build</i>	Research projects, essays, plans, or designs that require students to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make, build, design or generate something new	Drop Box (file submission), VoiceThread or Video (presentation)
