 - "collaboration-optional" tool for communication that can convey images, videos, and documents along with text, audio/visual comments, and stylus-driven annotations.

- Export credits
- All students and faculty already have account
- All faculty can have a Pro account



Pro accounts:

- Create Groups
- Upload Audio & Video Comments


Creating a VoiceThread

Gather materials

 Log into VoiceThread & click "Create"

Add Media"

- Provide title, description, and Playback Options
 - Allow media to process
- Comment and/or annotate each slide

Groups


Collection of Individuals, e.g.:


- Co-Teaching Faculty





Export

- Video archive of VoiceThread
 - non-interactive
- Upload to CoursePlus
 - Lecture Materials
 - Transcript
 - Original Media PDF
- Export Credits (HQ video)







Best Practices Using VoiceThread in your Course

Presentation Tips

- PowerPoint files older (ppt) seems to work better; optional PDF
- Audio and Video comments:
 - Save audio comments every minute or so, your next comment will run immediately after and it saves time if you make a mistake
 - Test your audio before you begin, and keep levels consistent
 - Record audio comments in a quiet, distraction-free space
- Keep a copy of your ppts, you cannot download them later from VT
- If using as lecture supplement export (using export credits) High Quality video

Making a VoiceThread Interactive

Allow students to practice; encourage video

- Set clear and detailed expectations for students
 - Audio/video comments should not exceed x-minutes (or 2-3 max)
 - Please respond to two or three other student's comments
 - Not everyone should respond to the prompt, after the first handful, respond to each other
 - Encourage critical thinking, similar to a classroom
 - Making connections, drawing conclusions
 - Asking questions for further discussion
 - Giving opinions

Check in, sum up what's been said, add new questions/slides to steer discussion

VoiceThread as a Tool for Assessment

- Avoid using class time to review entire VoiceThread presentations
- Evaluate individual comments on lecture (similar to Discussion Forum posts)
- Student-Created VoiceThreads
 - Decide how VT will be submitted
 - Evaluate Presentation
 - Private to Instructor or Shared with Class
 - Evaluate comments (similar to faculty's VT comments)
 - Consider Peer or Self Evaluation
